SUCCESSFUL STUDENTS:

- o **Are responsible and active.** Successful students get involved in their studies, accept responsibility for their own education, and are active participants in it!!!

- o **Ask questions.** Successful students ask questions to provide the quickest route between ignorance and knowledge. Go to your teachers. They will give you their time and are always excited to see a student who is interested and willing to learn.
- o **Learn that a student and a professor make a team.** Most instructors want exactly what you want: they would like for you to learn the material in their respective classes and earn a good grade.
- o **Don't sit in the back of the classroom.** Successful students minimize classroom distractions that interfere with learning. Being funny may be fine in the hallway, but in the classroom you may miss something or worse yet, distract other students. Be attentive in the classroom, not a distraction.
- o **Take good notes.** Successful students take notes that are understandable and organized, and review them often.
- o **Understand that actions affect learning.** Successful students know their personal behavior affects their feelings and emotions, which in turn can affect learning. Act like you're disinterested and you'll become disinterested. Act interested (even when you may not be) and watch how it changes your attitude and toward learning.

- o **Talk about what they're learning.** Successful students get to know something well enough that they can put it into words. Discuss your homework with other students or better yet, teach the subject to someone who doesn't understand. When a student is able to teach another, they begin to truly understand the concept.
- o **Don't cram for exams.** Successful students know that divided periods of study are more effective than cram sessions, and they practice it.
- o **Are good time managers.** Successful students do not procrastinate. They have learned that time control is life control and have consciously chosen to be in control of their life.
